#### **Economy - October 22 8-9a Pacific/11-12p Eastern**

**Valentin Bolotnyy** is the Kleinheinz Fellow at the Hoover Institution at Stanford University. He works on topics across public and labor economics, often partnering with government agencies to improve public services and gain insight into social behavior.

**Chris Surro** is an Assistant Adjunct Professor in the Department of Economics at UCLA. His research focuses on using recent computational methods to improve economic analysis.

**Jeron Impresso** is a Research Associate for Health Policy at the Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget. Jeron works on analyzing a variety of health care and policy related issues, including rising health care costs, pharmaceutical patent reforms, provider consolidation, and alternative payment models.

**Mark H. Michalski, MD** was the Executive Director of the Massachusetts General Hospital & Brigham Women's Hospital Center for Clinical Data Science, which is focused on the application and translation of novel machine learning techniques into clinical practice. Previous to this role, Dr. Michalski held leadership and operational roles at early-stage companies in the medical software and device domain, including Butterfly Network and Hyperfine Research.

**Panagis Galiatsatos, MD** is a pulmonary and critical care medicine physician. He is an expert in the diagnosis and treatment of obstructive lung disease, tobacco cessation, and in the care of critically ill patients in the Medical ICU. Dr. Galiatsatos is interested in understanding how socioeconomic variables impact health care outcomes and result in health disparities.
